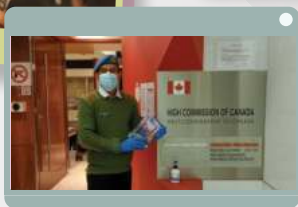
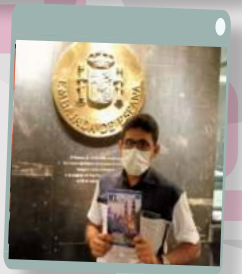

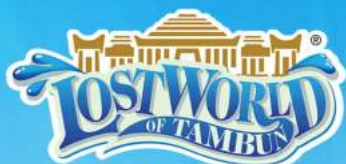

Ways To Get to KL City Centre By Air

From KLIA & KLIA 2

KLIA Express and KLIA Transit trains will operate for 35 minutes, with fares ranging from RM 35 to RM55. The current frequency is every three hours. The Airport Coach bus will cost roughly RM10 and will operate from 12.30 am to 11.30 pm. Aerobus operates from 6.45 a.m. to 6.45 p.m., with fares starting at RM14. Taxis are quite pricey. The fare starts at RM74 and goes up to roughly RM200 with the family. A 40 to 45-minute drive in a GrabCar will cost roughly RM65 to RM75

From Penang International Airport

Flights from Penang Airport to KLIA Airport will take approximately one hour and will cost between RM70 to RM650. The bus is the most affordable option, with fares ranging from RM50 to RM60. However, the duration will be at least 7 hours. Driving from Penang to Kuala Lumpur will take roughly 5 hours, depending on traffic, with estimated petrol expenses ranging from RM79 to

From Langkawi International Airport

Depending on the airline, flights from Langkawi International Airport to KLIA Airport will take roughly an hour. The beginning fare ranges from RM160 to RM200. Flights from Langkawi to Subang Airport take around an hour. Then take a bus to Kuala Lumpur. The starting fare ranges from RM119 to RM176.

From Subang Skypark Terminal

Skypark Link train will cost around RM10 from Subang Airport to Kuala Lumpur Sentral. Jet Bus operates from 9.00 a.m. to 7.15 p.m., with traveling time ranging from 20 to 30 minutes, depending on traffic. To Kuala Lumpur, the fare starts at RM10. GrabCar would cost between RM24 to RM27 to KL Sentral for an approximate 20 minute journey.

From Kuching International Airport

Flights from Kuching International Airport to KLIA Airport take about 1 hour 45 minutes, depending on the airline, such as AirAsia, Malindo Air, or Malaysia Airlines. Then, from the airport, take the KLIA Express to Kuala Lumpur Sentral. Depending on the season, the starting fare ranges from RM160 to RM650. Flights from Kuching to Subang Skypark Terminal take about 2 hours and 30 minutes. Then take a bus to Kuala Lumpur. Depending on the season, the starting fare ranges from RM289 to RM581.

From Kota Kinabalu International Airport

Flights from Kota Kinabalu International Airport (KKIA) to KLIA Airport take about 2 hours and 25 minutes, depending on the airline. The starting fare ranges from RM380 to RM1378. Flights from Kota Kinabalu International Airport to Subang Airport take about 2 hours and 30 minutes. Then, take a bus to Kuala Lumpur. Depending on the season, the starting fare ranges from RM289 to RM581.

Express Train

One of the fastest modes of transportation to travel to and from the airport is the KLIA Ekspres that takes approximately 25 to 35 minutes. However, the ticket price is quite costly, starting from RM 55 per pax for a one way ticket. The express train travels between International Airports (KLIA and KLIA2) to KL Sentral. You may purchase the train ticket online or head to its main station at KL Sentral. The service provides a free porter service at respective platforms and also high speed WiFi onboard. Alternatively, you can hitch a ride on the less expensive but non-direct route trains such as the KTM, MRT, LRT and Monorail.

Bus

Buses are the cheapest mode of transportation to get from the airport to the city and vice versa. They are relatively safe and fairly comfortable, made up of a fleet of 44-seated air conditioned coaches. The fare is quite affordable; from RM 12 to RM 15 per pax, depending on your pick up station. Therefore, the journey to and from the airport to the respective bus station may vary. However, the standard travel time is approximately 1 hour to 1 hour 15 minutes.

Taxi

Taxis are not exactly known to have a good reputation in Malaysia. Most locals avoid using taxis due to their high rates and non-standardized usage of meter and tracking. Hence taxis are not a very popular mode of transportation, but if passengers have no other choice, it is advisable to ask the driver beforehand if they can use the provided meter to get to a specific destination. Generally, the fare is estimated to be around RM3 for the first kilometer with RM0.20 added for every subsequent 150 meters. The journey can last for about 1 to 2 hours but keep in mind that this varies in both location and traffic.

E-hailing service

As one of the most popular modes of transportation in Malaysia, the E-hailing service has caught the attention of both locals and visitors due to its high reliability and access through its user-friendly mobile app, making it one of the fastest ways to get to a specific destination provided that the traffic is minimal. One of the best reasons to use the E-hailing service is the transparent and fixed fares made clear even before you make a booking. Passengers are also covered with accident insurance the moment they enter a car provided through the E-hailing service.

The University of Malaya (or Universiti Malaya in Malay; commonly known as UM) is the oldest university in Malaysia, and is in southwest Kuala Lumpur, situated on a 750 acre (3.0 km²) campus in the capital city. It is widely recognised as one of the top Universities in Malaysia.

7 Culture

Malaysia is an unimaginably assorted country, containing numerous distinctive ethnicities, dialects and religions. Individuals from each ethnicity have by and large held their ancestors' social traditions. As a result, Malaysian society obliges a wealthy assortment of ways of life, convictions and values.

8 World War 2

World War 2 The Malayan campaign began when the 25th Army, under the command of Lieutenant General Tomoyuki Yamashita, invaded Malaya on 8 December 1941. Japanese troops launched an amphibious assault on the northern coast of Malaya at Kota Bharu and started advancing down the eastern coast of Malaya.

9 Religion

There are many religions in Malaysia we are called as "1 Malaysia". The official of Malaysia Religion is Islam. Population and Housing Census, 63.5 percent of the population practices Islam; 18.7 percent Buddhism; 9.1 percent Christianity; 6.1 percent Hinduism; and 2.7 percent other religion or no information.

Petronas Towers, the world's tallest two towers, was built in just six years in Kuala Lumpur city. A Japanese partnership led by the Hazama Corporation built Tower 1, the west tower. On the other hand, Tower 2 was built by a South Korean consortium led by the Samsung C&T Corporation.



History of Kuala Lumpur

Kuala Lumpur became the capital of the province of Selangor in 1887. The city was already known as Kuala Lumpur, which meant 'Muddy Confluence' at the time. This is the result of the confluence of the two rivers Gombak and Klang. These rivers served as the city's main entry points.

19th century - Sumatrans may have settled in the upper reaches of Klang River

1840 - Chinese miners were involved in tin mining up the Selangor River

1857 - Once Kuala Lumpur became established as a town, the miners arrived in Kuala Lumpur and proceeded on foot to Ampang, where the first mine was established. 87 tin miners found rich sources of tin.

1862 - As a result of the influx of new miners from all over the world, there are numerous disputes and gang warfare.

1869 - Yap Ah Loy became the leader of the Chinese community of Kuala Lumpur, and in just a few years, he established peace and order in the city. He had the greatest influence in Kuala Lumpur, he founded Kuala Lumpur's first school and a destitute refuge.

1880: British envoy Frank Swettenham creates the first city plan for Kuala Lumpur, transforming it into a modern metropolis.

1881: Kuala Lumpur was a small city with numerous social and political issues. The town's buildings were made of wood, which were prone to fire, and there was a constant threat of flooding due to a lack of proper sanitation.

1886: Swettenham also pushed the construction of a railway line between Klang and Kuala Lumpur, which improved access to Kuala Lumpur and accelerated the town's expansion, resulting in the town's fast expansion.

1890: The population was 4,500, and by 1890, it had risen to 20,000. As growth accelerated, cleanliness, waste disposal, and other health concerns became more pressing. On May 14, 1890, a Sanitary Board was established, which was in charge of cleanliness, road maintenance, street lighting, and other duties

Greater Kuala Lumpur encompasses the region west of the Federal Territory of Kuala Lumpur to Port Klang, east to the Titiwangsa Mountains, and north and south to the Titiwangsa Mountains. The Klang Valley Integrated Transit System serves the area, which includes administratively independent towns and cities such as Klang, Shah Alam, Putrajaya, and others. The construction of a new Kuala Lumpur City Centre around Jalan Ampang and the Petronas Towers are two notable projects in Kuala Lumpur.

1896: The Sultans of four states have united to form the Federated Malay States. Kuala Lumpur becomes the Federated Malay States' capital.

1942: During World War II, Kuala Lumpur was captured by the Imperial Japanese Army on 11 January 1942 to 15 August 1945. The "3 years and 8 months" period nearly brought Kuala Lumpur's economy to a halt.

1946: Kuala Lumpur becomes capital in the Federation of Malaya.

1957: After 151 years of British rule, Malaysia declares independence on August 31. Kuala Lumpur became the capital of the Independent Federation of Malaya.

1963: Kuala Lumpur becomes capital of Malaysia

1972: Kuala Lumpur was awarded city status, making it the first town in Malaysia to do so after independence.

1974: Kuala Lumpur later became a federal territory on February 1

1978: The city of Shah Alam was proclaimed the new state capital in, Kuala Lumpur ceased to be the capital of Selangor

1990: Kuala Lumpur commemorated its 100th year of local government on May 14

1999: The federal administrative capital of Malaysia moves to Putrajaya.

2007: Kuala Lumpur celebrates its 50th year as capital of Malaysia and Malaysia its 50th year of independence

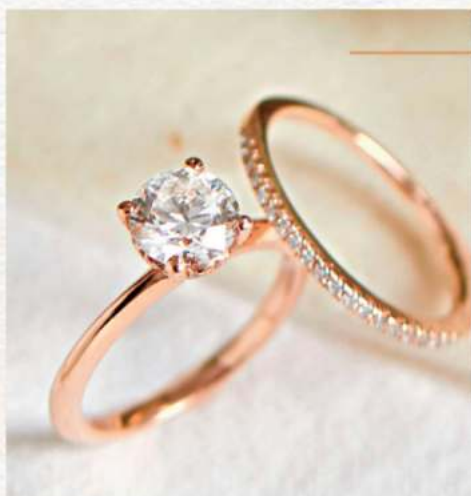

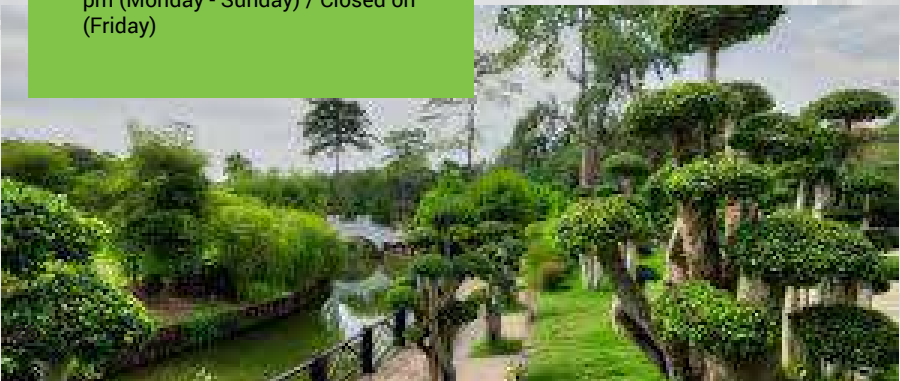

They are linguistically more different than the Malays, speaking a variety of Chinese languages in Peninsular Malaysia, the most important which is Hokkien and Hainanese, which are Southern Min languages, as well as Cantonese, and Hakka. The Chinese New Year is Malaysia's most important Chinese festival.

Indian

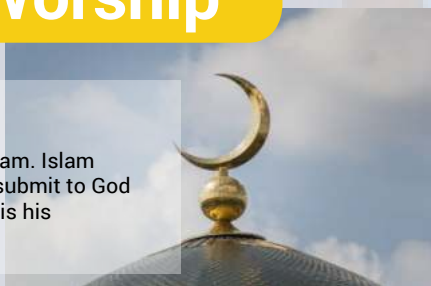
Kites or Wau

Bajau

The Bajau were already respected as ocean vagabonds, and they did in fact spend their entire lives on Lipa-lipa vessels. Iranun

Within the 16th century, there was a sea-based kingdom called Uranen. The individuals who came from this kingdom we presently call the Iranun. They were driven by a sultan (Islamic political pioneer), and the kingdom applied power in Mindanao Island within the southern Philippines and what is presently Brunei and Malaysia's state of Sabah.

Lun Bawang

The word Lun Bawang implies individuals of the nation or local individuals, while Lun Dayeh implies upriver individuals or individuals of the insides or Orang Ulu and Lun Lod implies individuals living downriver or close to the ocean. Other names are inferred from geological reference to their rice development, for illustration, Lun Baa' (swamps) who live close to swampy ranges and develop damp rice, and Lun Tana' Luun (on the arrival) who develop dry rice.

Costume

Sabah culture is so colourful. We have over 30 indigenous and 200 sub-ethnic groups, most of them have distinct traditional costumes, a heritage that tells the world their identity, traditions, and stories. Sabah is beautiful because of this cultural diversity. I've been photographing Sabah traditional costumes for 15 years and would like to share what I think are the 10 most beautiful traditional costumes of Sabah (not in any order).



Music

The melodic legacy of Sabah may be a phenomenal collection of rhythms and sounds, developments and colours. With over 30 distinctive ethnic substances this is often as it were normal, more so since Sabahans basically adore music and melody. There's barely any ceremony that would not require the backup of music, whereby the instrument of choice in Borneo is the gong. Gong outfits are still de rigueur at Kadazan and Dusun weddings, fair as are, these days, the advanced percussion rebellious and synthesizers of a modern band.



Festivals

This celebration is celebrated with much ceremony by the Bajau community of Sabah's east coast locale of Semporna. Individuals of this angling community have been celebrating this occasion in respect of their convention of building "lepa", a conventional single-mast cruising pontoon. The strategy of building these water crafts made from ruddy wood has been given over from era to era. Dance

Sumazau is the iconic move of Sabah. It's a conventional move begun from the Kadazan and Dusun (or Kadazandusun) individuals, the biggest inborn bunch of Sabah. The artists mirror the hawk in flight by extending their arms to both sides and swing them up and down like fowl wings. As a rule Sumazau is moved in a bunch of male and female accomplices as sets, who move with the beat of gong and drum. Ordinarily Sumazau is performed in social occasions and celebrations.



Arts & Craft

Sabah is domestic to a few tribes that have coexisted and mixed concordantly. My slant towards tribal expressions drove me to investigate the conventional expressions and creations of the inborn tribes of North Borneo. Weaving has been the spine of the tribes of Sabah. The wealth of Rattan within the rich timberlands naturally transformed to craftsmanship within the lives of the tribal society.



Games

Binsulong (other names: Inuog Dazang / Teka Teki Puteri) is a traditional game of Kadazandusun people. Binsulong could be a traditional diversion of Kadazandusun individuals. There's a string "trapped" interior the double-loop rattan winding and you wish to drag it out without cutting the string.

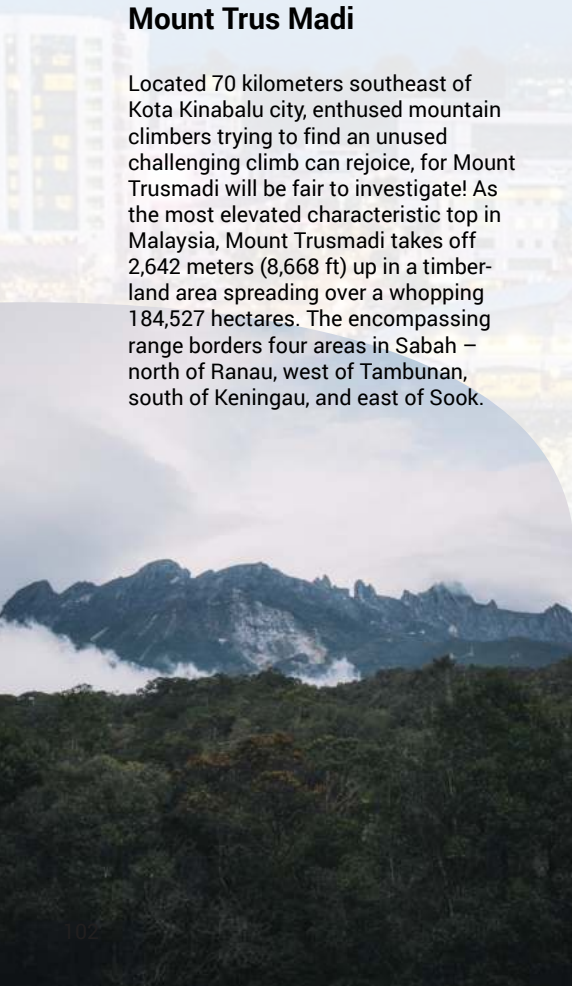

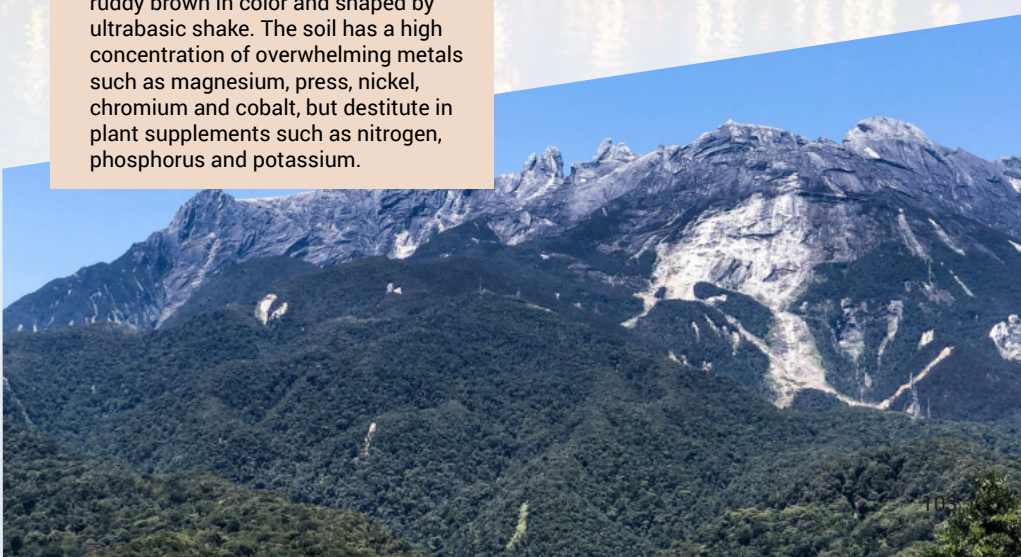

Forest & Park

Danum Valley

Sepilok Forest Reserve

Sepilok comprises 43 square kilometers on the edge of Kabili-Sepilok Forest Reserve. The Kinabatangan River, which flows for nearly 500 kilometres through Sabah's lowlands to the Sulu Sea, is a mosaic of riparian forest, oxbow lakes, nipah swamp, and mangroves that supports a diverse range of animals and birds. These creatures have become remarkably tolerant to human presence. The sanctuary is one of just two places on the planet where 10 different primate species may be found, four of which are native to Borneo.

Sabahan cuisine is a Malaysian regional cuisine. Sabah food, like the rest of Malaysian cuisine, is based on staples such as rice with a wide variety of other ingredients and methods of food preparation due to the influence of the state's varied geography and indigenous cultures that were quite distinct from Peninsular Malaysia's regional cuisines. Sabah, like its neighbour Sarawak, is known for its multi-ethnic population.

Sabah is a true melting pot of cultures and races, which is reflected in the abundance of delectable food that can only be found here. For more than a century, the indigenous of Borneo have welcomed people of all races to their beautiful land, giving rise to cuisines unseen (and we believe you have never tasted!) in any other region of the world. Taste the local dishes created by Borneo's five primary ethnic communities: Kadazan Dusuns, Muruts, Lundayeh, Rungus, and Bajau. Their cuisine is abundant in natural products, including lush greens, wild meats, edible flowers, and medicinal plants acquired from the forest and sea. Because of the inherently kind character of the natives, different races have felt accepted, and as a result, Sabah can now brag of its multicultural community and vast assortment of authentic local and fusion food!

Most travel to Sabah for the above reasons but if you spend a little more time there and wander into the nooks and crannies of the local hangout spots, you'll come across a myriad of scrumptious Sabahan food hideouts that the average tourist wouldn't be aware of.

Be it seafood, unusual meat, or local takes on the usual Malaysian breakfast – there's something in this local Sabah food list that will satisfy every foodie's craving.

Must Try Dishes & Snacks



Sago Grub (Butod)

Locally known as Butod, Sago Grub or Sago Worm is both a delicacy and the most repulsive dish in Sabah. Junk food always seems appealing, but it is harmful to your health. Sago Grub, on the other hand, is an unappealing yet nutritious dish. Putting this wriggling creature in your mouth, on the other hand, is a daring act.

Bambangan

Borneo's bambangan stands out from other mangoes for a few reasons. It has a distinct appearance, with rough brown skin and a large size (a single fruit can reach more than five pounds). It has a distinct aroma, with ripe types producing a nasty, durian-like aroma. And it certainly tastes different, with a savoury flavour evocative of French onion soup and eggs floating on a sour foundation.



Sang Nyuk Mee

Pork Noodle, also known as Sang Nyuk Mee, is a traditional Sabah dish. Other Malaysians mistake Sang Nyuk Mee for Mixed Pork Noodle, yet Sang Nyuk Mee is exclusive to Sabah. Fresh, smooth, and tender pork slices Sang Nyuk Mee literally translates to "Raw Pork Noodle." Don't worry, the pork isn't consumed raw. It actually denotes that the meat is made from fresh pork.



Tuhau

Tuhau is a species of wild ginger found in the rainforests of Sabah and Borneo that is used to prepare the meal of the same name. The dish is similar to a relish in that it is both a condiment (usually served with fish) and a cuisine on its own.

Pinaasakan

Pinasakan (Pinaasakan or Pinarasakan) Sada is a popular traditional cuisine of the Kadazandusun tribe in Sabah. Sardines are cooked and blended with bambangan (a typical mango fruit), takob-takob or asam gelugur, turmeric, and salt in this recipe. This meal is long-lasting and can be kept for several days.

Sabah Traditional Food

Sinalau Bakas (Smoked Wild Boar)

When travelling from Kota Kinabalu to Kinabalu Park or Kundasang in Sabah, the only sensible ground path includes driving a long stretch of curving uphill road that is a motorcyclist's paradise. On this road, you'll come across a few roadside kiosks that are really smokey, and this is where you'll find Sinalau Bakas, a must-try indigenous Dusun meal for individuals who consume non-halal food.

Sinalau Bakas translates to "smoked wild boar," and the dish is as simple as it sounds: slabs of marinated wild boar meat cooked on an open BBQ pit, with the operator usually squinting or perched on a small "bangku" fanning the wood fire below.

Kuih Pinjaram, the UFO Cake of Sabah

Because of its flying saucer shape, Kuih pinjaram (or Penyaram, Penjaram, Cucur Jawa) is known as "UFO cake." Though pinjaram is a traditional snack of the Bajau and Bruneian Malay people of Sabah (Malaysia), it has become one of Sabahans' favourite snacks to accompany their tea or coffee break.

Pinjaram is a circular, sweet cake with a soft and chewy texture. It has a crunchy edge yet is fluffy and bouncy in the middle. Because pinjaram is made of rice flour, cornflour, sugar, and coconut milk, eating a couple as your breakfast enhances your energy and mood.

Kuih Cincin, The Ring Cookie

Say yes to a wedding ring for a happy life, and yes to Kuih Cincin (Ring Cookie or Ring Biscuit) for a joyful food. Kuih Cincin is a traditional snack of the Brunei-Malay and Bajau people of Malaysia's Sabah State. Many Sabahans like this sweet and crunchy biscuit as a tasty accompaniment to their coffee or tea break.

Kuih cincin literally translates to "ring cake," although I believe it is better classified as a cookie or biscuit. Kuih cincin is distinguished by its resemblance to the spherical contour of a flower drawing. The cookie smells like sugar with a dash of coconut.

Kota Kinabalu's Best Fresh Fish Noodle

Across Peninsular Malaysia, fish noodles are normally prepared with sweet carnation milk, but they are totally different on the East side, just like the ones in Sabah! Different types of broth, fish meat noodles, fish skin, fish meat texture, and cooking styles are all worth exploring! Let's take a closer look at why these fish noodles are a must-try in Kota Kinabalu right now.

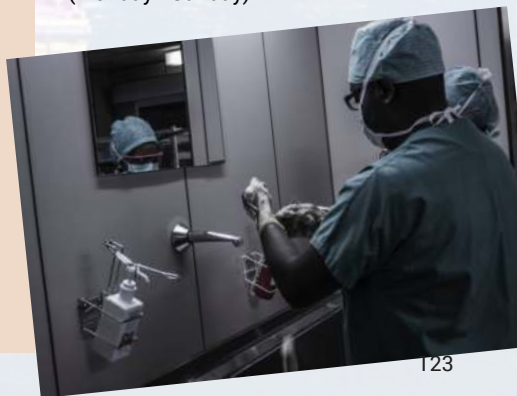
