TRANSPORTATION





FROM KLIA & KLIA 2

The KLIA Express train offers a top-notch, quick airport transfer service to KLIA and KLIA 2 every day from 5AM to 12PM. The KLIA Express will reach KLIA and KLIA 2 in about 35 to 40 minutes, respectively, from the city centre. The price of a one-way ticket is merely RM55. Also, you can save 25% off standard prices when you reserve the Group Saving Package.

In addition, there is an Airport Coach bus that runs from 12.30AM to 11.30PM and costs about RM10.The Aero bus travels every five to 20 minutes from early in the morning until late at night, all throughout the year. You can take a bus to KLIA or KLIA 2 from KL Sentral and then return to the city centre and the ticket costs RM14. It provides a 5-star affordable service in addition to a 10% discount.

Taxis are also quite expensive while travelling from the city centre to the airport. If you're with your family, the cost goes from RM80 to roughly RM200. However, it will only take 40 to 45 minutes to travel from Klang Valley to KLIA and KLIA 2, and Grab will cost from RM65 as it is a fixed rate. Given that it is more commodious and pleasant, we strongly advise you to take Grab.

FROM PENANG INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

It takes around an hour to fly from Penang Airport to KLIA, and the fare ranges from RM70 to RM650. Aside from that, the cheapest method of travel to KL from Penang is by bus, with prices starting at RM50 to RM60. However, the duration of each trip from Penang to KL by bus will be between seven to eight hours. However, driving from Penang to Kuala Lumpur will take around six hours, depending on traffic.



FROM SUBANG SKYPARK TERMINAL

From KL Sentral to Subang Airport, passengers are transported by SKY-PARK Link trains. In Kuala Lumpur, it is an express train service. SkyPark Link now provides 32 daily services at intervals of 30 to 60 minutes. The fare from Subang Airport to Kuala Lumpur City is about RM3.50 each way.

FROM LANGKAWI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

There are flights that may get you from Langkawi International Airport to KLIA in around an hour and ten minutes. The base prices for the flight range from RM160 to RM200. Aside from that, flights from Langkawi to Subang Airport won't take very long to get to the destination - around 58 minutes. The cost of the bus from Langkawi to KL, which includes the cost of the ferry to the island, ranges from RM118 to RM176 per person.

FROM KOTA KINABALU INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

There is no other way to get from Sabah to KL than by plane. Kota Kinabalu International Airport (KKIA) to KLIA will take approximately 2 hours and 25 minutes, and tickets cost between RM380 and RM1380

FROM KUCHING INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Flights from Kuching International Airport to KLIA will take about 2 hours and 45 minutes. Kuching International Airport is located 11 kilometres south of the city's centre. Flights to KL are run by Malaysia Airlines, Air Asia, and Malindo Air. Also, the flight from Kuching to Subang Airport takes 2 hours and 23 minutes and costs between RM289 to RM581.

Train

The KLIA Express train, which travels in around 28 minutes, is one of the quickest methods to go from the airport to the city centre. The cost of each ticket, however, is only RM55. The train connects KLIA and KLIA 2 International Airports with KL Sentral

You can buy rail tickets online or by going to KL Sentral, the train's major station. The service offers high speed WiFi on board as well as a free porter service at the appropriate platforms.

In addition, there are various rail services that will take you to Kuala Lumpur's city centre. The MRT, LRT, KL Monorail, and KTM are the available train services.







Bus

Without a doubt, buses are the most affordable way to travel between either airport and the city. They consist of a fleet of 44 seated, air-conditioned coaches and are generally safe and comfortable. Depending on your pick-up station, each bus trip costs a little as RM15 per passenger. There may be a difference in how long it takes to go from the airport to the specific bus station. Nonetheless, the average journey duration is 1 hour and 15 minutes.

In addition, RapidKL buses offer feeder bus service to MRT, LRT, and Monorail stations as well as transportation inside the Klang Valley to KL City. In addition to providing free buses, there are unique services provided by companies like Go KL, Smart Selangor, PJ City and others.

ALTERNATE WAY TO KL CITY CENTER

Taxi

Although taxis are less popular now since they are usually more expensive than E-hailing services, they are still available. Due to their exorbitant prices and lack of standardisation, taxis are generally avoided by locals. If there is no other option, passengers should ask the taxi driver in advance if they can use the given metre to get to a specified location to avoid paying an expensive cost. The average fee is RM3 for the first kilometre, and an additional RM0.20 is charged for every further 150 metres.



E- Hailing Service

E-hailing services are currently one of the most popular forms of transportation in Malavsia. The e-hailing service is extensively utilised by both locals and travellers due to its high reliability and accessibility through a user-friendly mobile app, making it one of the guickest ways to go to a specific location if there isn't much traffic. One of the best reasons to use the e-hailing service is the predetermined pricing that is available even before you make a reservation, and they are often already covered by accident insurance. Today, a number of applications, including GrabCar, AirAsia Ride, MyCar, In-Driver, Kumpool, and others, provide e-hailing services.

Kuala Lumpur, the capital of Malaysia, is renowned for its magnificent skyscrapers and other exquisite examples of modern architecture. We all know that Malaysia has a diverse population, therefore KL city offers a variety of cultural attractions for you to explore. Kuala Lumpur spans a territory of around 243 square kilometres. It is also regarded as one of the urban areas in Southeast Asia that is seeing both a significant increase in population and economic growth.

At the moment, it is the ninth most visited city worldwide.

Around 2.0 million people, or 25% of Malaysia's total population, called Kuala Lumpur home as of 2021. From 2010 to 2020, Kuala Lumpur's annual population change climbed gradually by 2.2%. The city is situated at the junction of the Gombak and Klang Rivers and is not far from Peninsular Malaysia's western coast. It is located 300 kilometres northwest of Singapore and roughly 40 kilometres east of the Strait of Malacca.

In addition, it is situated in the state of Selangor's administrative centre. Did you know that Kuala Lumpur's name in Malay means "muddy estuary"? This is so because the Klang and Gombak rivers converge in KL City. The Federal Territory of Kuala Lumpur, one of Malaysia's three Federal Territories along with Putrajaya and Labuan, is situated along the state of Selangor's central west coast. KL has hosted many major sports, political and cultural events throughout the years, most notably the 1998 Commonwealth Games and the 2017 Sea Games.

Last but not least, according to Moody's Analytics, Malaysia's economy would likely develop moderately in 2023, with the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) projected to increase by 4.1% following an exceptional 8.7% rise in 2022. With the decreased year-over-year increase of 7.0% in the fourth quarter of 2022 compared to 14.2% in the third quarter, it was predicted that economic growth would decline even further in the following quarters. The GDP of Malaysia grew by 8.7% in 2022, the greatest rate in more than 20 years.

10 FUN FACTS

1.Meaning of Kuala Lumpur

Meaning of Kuala Lumpur
The name Kuala Lumpur is derived from
the Malay word lumpur, which means
"mud" and refers to the confluence of two
rivers. It is where the Gombak and Klang
rivers meet. Kuala Lumpur had not yet
been built when 87 Chinese tin miners
hurried up the Klang River and founded a
colony at the muddy confluence of the river
in 1857. Soon after, Kuala Lumpur was
given its name.

3.World's Tallest Twin Towers Is in KL

The Petronas Twin Towers are the world's tallest twin towers until 2022. However, it is one of the tallest buildings in Malaysia until Merdeka 118 that had recently surpassed it.

5.The Malaysian King lives in KL@Istana Budaya

The Yang di-Pertuan Agong's official house is Istana Negara, usually referred to as the National Palace, and it is located on Jalan Duta in Kuala Lumpur.

2.Parliamentary Democracy System

Malaysia is a parliamentary democracybased constitutional monarchy. His Majesty the King is the sovereign of the nation. The parliament is the most important institution in a country that preserves democratic values.



4. Malaysian Government is in Putrajaya

Instead of being in the capital city, Putrajaya is where the Malaysian government is located. Putrajaya is the administrative and judicial capital of the nation and is home to numerous government offices.





6. Yang di-Pertuan Agong is an Elected Monarch

Notwithstanding the fact that Malaysia does not have an absolute monarchy, the Yang di-Pertuan Agong is chosen by the Conference of Rulers for a five-year term under a unique rotational system. The Agong is chosen by the Conference of Rulers from among the Malay emperors. The Third Schedule of the Constitution and the Conference of Rulers both provide detailed descriptions of the election's process and procedures.

7. Home To The Second Tallest Tower in the World

The Merdeka 118 Tower is the secondtallest structure in the world, did you know that? With a height of 678.9 metres and 118 stories, it is the newest highest structure in Malaysia. The building is known as Merdeka 118 since it has 118 levels. The structure is slated to debut in 2023. The outstretched hand gesture made by Tunku Abdul Rahman on Malaysia's Independence Day while chanting "Merdeka!" served as both a model and inspiration for the building's design.

8. KL Was the First Country in Asia to Host the Commonwealth

The 1998 Asian Games were held for the first time in Kuala Lumpur. The 2010 Games took place in Delhi and were staged in Asia once more.

9. Hosted the SEA Games in 2017

Kuala Lumpur received praise for hosting the 2017 Sea Games. It not only improved the country's standing but also surpassed previous records in terms of medal haul.


10. KL is The Retail and Fashion Hub of Malavsia

HISTORY OF KUALA LUMPUR

The name Kuala Lumpur, which in Malay means "muddy confluence", was coined when tin miners went to the Klang river in Ampang to prospect the area for some mine and they took use of the dual valleys of the rivers Gombak and Klang. Therefore, Kuala Lumpur's name was created. Here is a look at Kuala Lumpur's history in chronological order.



87 tin miners searched the Kuala Lumpur region for rich tin supplies before discovering enormous reserves in Ampang.

When Kuala Lumpur grew quickly, more miners from various locations arrived and settled there. There were numerous disputes and gang battles among the society as a result of the population growth.

Yap Ah Loy, the head of the Chinese neighbourhood in Kuala Lumpur, made the decision to impose law and order there. He was also the first to found Kuala Lumpur's first school as well as a homeless shelter.

Frank Sweetenham, a British envoy, had created a city plan to modernise Kuala Lumpur.

The city of Kuala Lumpur was chosen to serve as Selangor's capital.

With the union of the four state's sultans, Kuala Lumpur was chosen as the Federated Malay State's capital.

The first train station in Kuala Lumpur was restored and created by Arthur Benison Hubback, the most productive and gifted British colonial architect.

5 TIPS EVERY TRAVELER SHOULD KNOW BEFORE VISITING KUALA LUMPUR

Here are five tips that each visitor to Kuala Lumpur should keep in mind:

1. Be wary of scammers

Travellers in KL are encouraged to exercise caution and avoid becoming victims of scams. Be particularly watchful of phoney calls and texts that pretend to be from government agencies and come from unidentified or questionable numbers. Nowadays, con artists frequently pose as the identities of legitimate companies in an effort to dupe people into giving them vital information. It is necessary to report any scamming groups by dialling 997 if you come across any.

2. Make sure the taximeters are turned on by the drivers

By the time you begin your trip, taxi drivers must have turned on their taxi metres. If they won't do it, you can exit the taxi and get another one. This is so that it is against the law to charge a passenger without using the metre.

3. Avoid going down any dark alleys

Although KL is renowned for its exciting nightlife, there are some places where it may be pretty shady. It is strongly advised to walk with other people and avoid walking alone, especially in dimly lit areas. You do not want to become a robbery victim!

4. Bring clothing that is appropriate for hot temperatures

Average annual temperatures in Malaysia's tropical region are oppressive at 30°C. Only a pair of flip-flops and a pair of shoes should be packed, along with some light, loose-fitting cotton clothing. Pack a hoodie or lightweight jacket in addition, as Malaysia has a tendency to keep the air conditioning on in chilly places like buses, trains, and shopping malls. Also, because the weather in this area is liable to change, you should always be prepared to always carry an umbrella.

5. Malaysia is a dazzling diverse nation

In addition to ethnic Malay Muslims, ethnic Chinese, Tamil Indians, and twelve indigenous communities known as "orang asli" live in Kuala Lumpur, which is multiethnic but primarily Islamic. This implies that mosques, churches, and Hindu temples coexist with Chinese temples decorated with red lanterns. The three main languages of KL are Bahasa Malaysia, Mandarin, and Tamil. To get around, you might need to acquire a little bit of Bahasa Malaysia!



Coronary artery disease (CAD) is the biggest killer in the world for the past 15 years, accounting to about 9 million deaths in 2015, according to the World Health Organization (WHO).

Due to inadequate blood supply to the heart, people with CAD often suffer from angina, often described as squeezing, pressure or pain in the chest, spreading to the shoulders, arms, and neck.

In the past, surgery or angioplasty is usually the only option available when a patient fails to respond to medication. Today, the Enhanced External Counterpulsation (EECP) provides an alternative to patients who prefer a non-invasive form of treatment for angina and heart disease.

During the EECP procedure, blood pressure cuffs are wrapped around the patients' legs. These cuffs squeeze and release in sync with the patient's heartbeat, promoting blood flow throughout the body, particularly to the heart. 

Masiid Negara

KL is home to the 1963-built National Mosque of Malaysia. The mosque, which is still steadfastly standing on its grounds, is now seen as a key symbol of Malaysia, an Islamic country. Some 15,000 people may fit in the mosque, which is encircled by a 13-acre tract of lush greenery. The mosque's two primary features are its 73-meter-high minarets and its main concrete roof, which is designed like a 16-pointed star. The mosque's architecture transmits a number of meanings. 



Ais Kacang

Ais kacang, also called ABC, is a popular Malaysian delicacy. It contains red beans, jelly, sweet syrup, and shaved ice. To give the ABC a more original touch, some people will additionally include fruits or sweet corn. Traditionally, an ice shaving machine, which was previously hand-cranked but is now more typically motorised, is used to churn out the shaved ice used in the dessert.

Tepung Pelita

Tepung Pelita is a pandan and santan custard two-layer kuih that is steamed in little banana leaf or pandan pots. Its centre is packed with sugar water, giving it a sweet creamy taste.

Mango Sticky Rice

One of the most popular desserts in the area is sticky rice, which is served with coconut milk and fruit like mangoes. A pleasing mix results from the texture of the fruit and sticky rice when additional coconut milk is added.

Roti John
