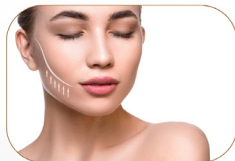

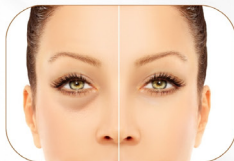

# TRANSPORTATION

## FROM KLIA & KLIA 2

Looking to travel from the airport to KL city? Not a problem! There are many ways. A trip on the KLIA Express train starts at 5 in the morning and finishes at midnight, with the journey taking approximately between 35 and 40 minutes to reach KL Sentral. The fare is RM55, however, passengers who travel in a group can get a 25% reduction.

You should try Airport Coach bus or Aero bus when saving money is your primary goal because they're an affordable mode of transport compared to others which are much expensive such as taxis whose charges range between RM80 to RM200 depending on distance covered from city center; moreover they operate at different times on daily basis than other forms like shared van: if you're looking forward to hiring an expensive taxi expect pay anything between RM200; if your concern is about price more than anything else then look no further than Grab who have fixed options and starts at about RM65: depending on what you want or can afford, there is always a way to suit your needs and budget!

## FROM SUBANG SKYPARK TERMINAL

Take a look at the SKYPARK Link trains if you're heading to KL Sentral from Subang Airport! They are trips between 30 and 60 minutes, ensuring that you reach your destination in time. Currently, there is an ongoing offer which allows travellers to take only one journey from Subang Airport to Kuala Lumpur City at about RM3.50.

*Note: The train service linking KTM's KL Sentral station and Skypark Terminal is temporarily unavailable*

## FROM PENANG INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Traveling from Penang to Kuala Lumpur can be done by air in one hour with tickets ranging from RM70 to RM650. Alternatively, budget-friendly buses cost RM50-60 and take 7-8 hours, while driving takes approximately 6 hours depending on traffic.

## FROM LANGKAWI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Travel from Langkawi International Airport to KLIA in slightly more than an hour, with ticket costs spanning from RM160 to RM200. Alternatively, opt for quicker flights to Subang Airport, clocking in around 58 minutes. If you favor a more picturesque journey, there's the bus option, which also incorporates a ferry ride from the island, with prices ranging between RM118 to RM176 per individual in total.

## FROM KOTA KINABALU INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

For a trip from Sabah to KL, flying is the most recommended option. Departing from Kota Kinabalu International Airport (KKIA) to KLIA, anticipate a flight lasting approximately 2 hours and 30 minutes. Ticket costs usually fall between RM380 to RM1380.

## FROM KUCHING INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

If you're planning to fly from Kuching to KL, the usual flight duration is around 2 hours. Kuching International Airport, situated 11 kilometers south of the city center, provides flights to KL through various airlines such as Malaysia Airlines, Air Asia, and Malindo Air. Ticket prices vary from RM289 to RM581.

## Train

For a fast and hassle-free trip from the airport to downtown, take the KLIA Express train! It takes about 28 minutes to get to KL Sentral, and tickets cost RM55, which is quite reasonable. You can buy tickets either online or at KL Sentral, the main station. Also, enjoy fast onboard WiFi and a free porter service on certain platforms. Moreover, Kuala Lumpur provides a range of rail services including MRT, LRT, KL Monorail, and KTM for smooth travel within the city centre. Easily navigate around and discover everything Kuala Lumpur has to offer!



## Bus

Buses offer the most economical transportation option from airports to the city, boasting a fleet of 44 air-conditioned coaches known for their safety and comfort. Fares can start as low as RM15 per person, and while travel times may vary, the average duration to reach the city is approximately 1 hour and 15 minutes. Additionally, RapidKL buses provide feeder services to MRT, LRT, and Monorail stations, making transportation within the Klang Valley and to KL City convenient. Various companies such as Go KL, Smart Selangor, and PJ City offer unique services, including free bus options. Explore Kuala Lumpur affordably and comfortably with these diverse bus services!



# ALTERNATE WAY TO KL CITY CENTER

## Taxi

Taxis, though still accessible, have become less favoured because of their higher fares in comparison to e-hailing services. Residents often opt for e-hailing due to their predictable pricing and lower expenses. However, if you decide to take a taxi, it's recommended to negotiate and confirm meter usage beforehand to avoid being charged excessively.



## E-Hailing Service

E-hailing services have gained immense popularity in Malaysia, embraced by both locals and tourists for their reliability and convenience via user-friendly mobile apps. These services provide a swift means of reaching destinations, particularly during periods of low traffic. The key attraction of e-hailing lies in its upfront pricing and the provision of accident insurance, making it a favoured option for many. # *Introduction To* **KUALA LUMPUR**

Kuala Lumpur, the vibrant capital of Malaysia, serves as a symbol of contemporary architecture and cultural richness, offering a multitude of attractions.

Encompassing an area of about 243 square kilometers, Kuala Lumpur is witnessing notable population expansion and economic advancement, ranking as the ninth most visited city globally. In 2021, around 25% of Malaysia's population, totaling approximately 2.0 million individuals, resided in Kuala Lumpur. Over the decade from 2010 to 2020, the city experienced a gradual population growth of 2.2%.

Situated at the convergence of the Gombak and Klang Rivers, Kuala Lumpur is positioned 300 kilometers northwest of Singapore and approximately 40 kilometers east of the Strait of Malacca. Its name, "Kuala Lumpur" in Malay, translates to "muddy estuary," reflecting its location where two rivers meet.

As one of Malaysia's three Federal Territories, alongside Putrajaya and Labuan, Kuala Lumpur has been the host city for significant events such as the 1998 Commonwealth Games and the 2017 Sea Games.

Looking forward, Malaysia's GDP appears poised for robust growth in 2024. In the third quarter of 2023, the gross domestic product (GDP) increased by 3.3%, bringing the growth for the initial nine months of 2023 to 3.9%. This corresponds with the government's projection of approximately 4% growth for 2023.



# HISTORY OF KUALA LUMPUR

The following is a chronological overview of Kuala Lumpur's historical progression along with its significant events until this current era.

**1857**

A group of 87 tin miners conducted exploration in the vicinity of Kuala Lumpur, discovering significant tin deposits in Ampang.

**1862**

The rapid growth of Kuala Lumpur attracted miners from various areas, leading to a rise in population as well as conflicts, disputes, and rivalries among gangs.

**1869**

Yap Ah Loy, who led the Chinese community in Kuala Lumpur, played a pivotal role in instituting law and order. Additionally, he initiated the establishment of the city's inaugural school and a refuge for the

A British representative named Frank Sweetenham formulated an urban development plan to modernize Kuala Lumpur.

**1887**

Selangor designated Kuala Lumpur as its capital city.

**1896**

After the union of the four state sultans, Kuala Lumpur was designated as the capital of the Federated Malay States.

**1910**

Arthur Benison Hubback, a prolific British colonial architect, was responsible for both the design and construction of Kuala Lumpur's inaugural railway station.

**1942**

The city was under Japanese occupation during World War II.

**1946**

Kuala Lumpur was established as the capital of the Malayan Federation.

On August 31, Malaysia celebrated its Independence Day, marking the end of 151 years of British rule as they opted to leave the country.

With an approximate population of 500,000, Kuala Lumpur encountered distinct administrative challenges.

Kuala Lumpur was appointed as the capital city of Malaysia.

Ethnic tensions escalated into a comprehensive civil conflict involving the Chinese and Malay communities.

Kuala Lumpur attained the status of a city, becoming the first town in Malaysia to achieve this milestone after gaining inde-

Kuala Lumpur became a Federal Territory with its own government.

Prime Minister Dr. Mahathir initiated the "Vision 2020" program during his tenure, bringing about modernization not only in Kuala Lumpur but across the entire nation.

Malaysia's federal administrative capital was relocated to Putrajaya.

Kuala Lumpur Sentral, a key transportation hub and business district, officially opened on June 13, 2001, connecting trains, buses, and the KLIA Ekspres in the capital city.

The 9.7 km Stormwater Management and Road Tunnel (SMART), the world's first dual-purpose underground motorway and water channel, was opened to reduce flooding in Kuala Lumpur's city center.

# KL *Then vs Now*

Kuala Lumpur, the capital city of Malaysia, has long been a concrete jungle set against the backdrop of scenic nature. Over the years, it has transformed into a modern marvel, evolving from its vibrant past through various challenges to become the iconic city it is today. Here are some comparisons showcasing Kuala Lumpur's evolution to a better city.

## 1. Dataran Merdeka

Dataran Merdeka, or "Independence Square," remains Malaysia's symbolic heart since August 31, 1957, when it saw the Union Jack lowered and the national flag raised, marking independence from British rule. Today, it thrives as a vibrant public space for picnics, events, and celebrations, attracting locals and tourists.





## 2. Masjid Jamek

Masjid Jamek, officially named Masjid Jamek Sultan Abdul Samad, is located at the confluence of the Gombak and Klang rivers. Completed in 1909 as Malaysia's first brick mosque, it was Kuala Lumpur's main mosque until Masjid Negara opened in 1965. Today, tourists can explore its interior and gardens outside prayer times.



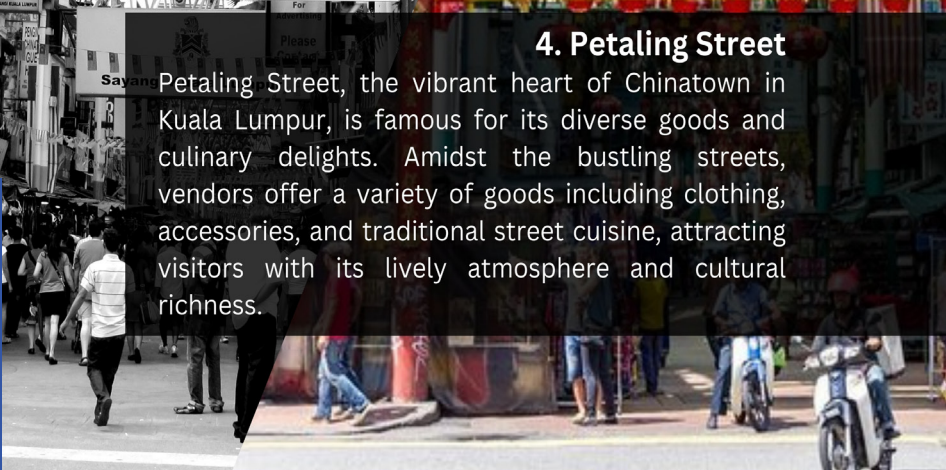
## 3. Kuala Lumpur City Centre

KLCC, known for the Petronas Twin Towers and Suria KLCC mall, was developed on former race track land. Initiated by former Prime Minister Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad, the iconic twin skyscrapers soar 451.9m high with an 88-floor steel and glass facade inspired by Islamic art motifs. KLCC Park and Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre are also located there.



#### 4. Petaling Street

Petaling Street, the vibrant heart of Chinatown in Kuala Lumpur, is famous for its diverse goods and culinary delights. Amidst the bustling streets, vendors offer a variety of goods including clothing, accessories, and traditional street cuisine, attracting visitors with its lively atmosphere and cultural richness.




#### 5. Central Market

Opened in 1888 as a wet market, the iconic Central Market boasts art deco architecture and heritage status. A tourist hotspot, it offers Malaysian arts, crafts, batik, vintage items, and souvenirs. Right beside it, the Kasturi Walk that was established in 2011, is a covered bazaar featuring stalls selling local snacks and souvenirs, marked by a large wau at its entrance.







## 6. Kuala Lumpur Railway Station

Kuala Lumpur Railway Station, famous for its stunning architecture, was once among the city's most photographed landmarks alongside Sultan Abdul Samad Building. Designed in an Indo-Saracenic style blending Western and Mughal influences, it housed the bustling Heritage Station Hotel until its closure in 2011. While less busy, it still serves some train services.

## 7. Medan Pasar

Medan Pasar emerged from the discovery of tin at the confluence of Sungai Klang and Sungai Gombak. Kapitan Cina Yap Ah Loy, the city's founding figure, established markets on his riverside land in the late 1800s. His home, named Medan Pasar, served as a vital hub for early commerce.



# DID YOU KNOW?

## Meaning of Kuala Lumpur

The term “Kuala Lumpur” stems from the Malay language, where “kuala” translates to “confluence” and “lumpur” means “mud.” This name is associated with the specific location where the Gombak and Klang rivers converge. The founding of Kuala Lumpur dates back to 1857 when a small group of 87 Chinese tin miners swiftly established a settlement at this muddy junction of rivers. Following this, the town was officially named Kuala Lumpur.

## Parliamentary Democracy System

Malaysia follows a political framework characterized by a constitutional monarchy and parliamentary democracy. Under this system, the King acts as the symbolic head of state, while the parliament holds significant authority in maintaining democratic values and overseeing governance.
