The book is written in a clear and concise style, and is well illustrated with numerous examples and quotations. It is a valuable work for anyone interested in the history and philosophy of capital punishment.

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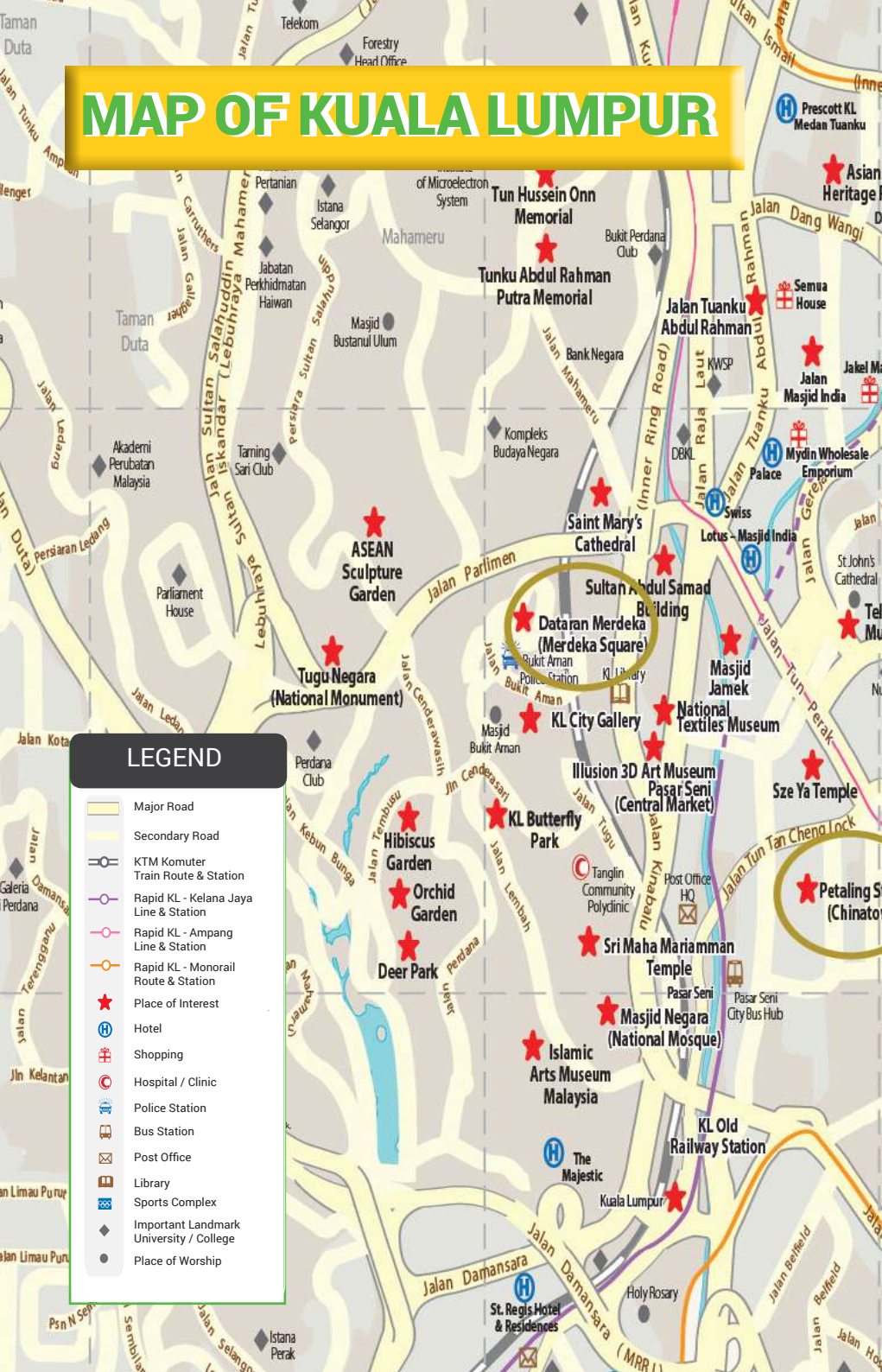
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# MAP OF KUALA LUMPUR

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# TRANSPORTATION

## FROM KLIA & KLIA 2

Need to get to the airport from the city? No worries! You've got options. The KLIA Express train runs every day from 5 AM to midnight, taking about 35-40 minutes to reach KLIA and KLIA 2. Tickets cost RM55, but if you travel with friends, you can get a 25% discount.

If you're on a budget, you can hop on the Airport Coach bus or Aero bus. The bus fares range from about RM10 to RM14, and they run pretty frequently throughout the day.

Taxis are available too, but they can be expensive, costing anywhere from RM80 to RM200. For a more affordable and comfortable ride, you can use Grab. They offer fixed-rate options starting from around RM65.

So, whether you prefer the train, bus, taxi, or Grab, there's a way to get to the airport that suits your needs and budget!

## FROM SUBANG SKYPARK TERMINAL

For travelers heading to Subang Airport from KL Sentral, check out the SKYPARK Link trains! They offer fast service within Kuala Lumpur with 32 daily trips, running every 30 to 60 minutes. Right now, there's a promotion, and a single journey from Subang Airport to Kuala Lumpur City costs around RM3.50.

## FROM PENANG INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Planning your trip from Penang to KL? Fly from Penang Airport to KLIA for a quick hour-long journey. Ticket prices range from RM70 to RM650, depending on your preferences. If you're looking for a budget-friendly option, consider taking a bus. Prices start at RM50 to RM60, but be prepared for a longer journey of around seven to eight hours. Driving is another choice, taking approximately six hours, though it can vary based on traffic conditions. Choose the option that suits your budget and schedule.

## FROM LANGKAWI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Fly from Langkawi International Airport to KLIA in just over an hour, with ticket prices ranging from RM160 to RM200. For an even faster option, consider flights to Subang Airport, taking around 58 minutes. If you prefer a scenic route, take the bus, which includes the ferry to the island. Prices range from RM118 to RM176 per person.

## FROM KOTA KINABALU INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

To travel from Sabah to KL, your best bet is air travel. From Kota Kinabalu International Airport (KKIA) to KLIA, expect a flight duration of around 2 hours and 25 minutes. Ticket prices typically range from RM380 to RM1380. Enjoy your journey!

## FROM KUCHING INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Looking to fly from Kuching to KL? The flight typically takes about 2 hours and 45 minutes. Kuching International Airport, located 11 kilometers south of the city center, offers connections to KL through airlines like Malaysia Airlines, Air Asia, and Batik Air. Ticket prices range from RM289 to RM581.





## ALTERNATE WAY TO KL CITY CENTER

### Taxi

Taxis, although still a viable option, have lost popularity due to their higher fares compared to e-hailing services. Locals tend to avoid taxis because of their unpredictable pricing and elevated costs. When opting for a taxi, passengers are recommended to negotiate and establish meter usage upfront to avoid excessive charges. Generally, the initial fare is approximately RM3 for the first kilometer, with an extra charge of RM0.20 for every 150 meters traveled.



### E-Hailing Service

E-hailing services have become incredibly popular in Malaysia, embraced by locals and tourists alike for their reliability and convenience through user-friendly mobile apps. These services offer a quick way to reach destinations, especially during low traffic times. The main draw of e-hailing is the upfront pricing and the inclusion of accident insurance, making it a preferred choice for many. Various apps like GrabCar, AirAsia Ride, InDrive, Kumpool, and more provide these convenient transportation options.



### Train

For a quick and convenient journey from the airport to the city center, hop on the KLIA Express train! It only takes around 28 minutes to reach KL Sentral, and tickets are priced at a reasonable RM55. You can purchase tickets online or at KL Sentral. Plus, enjoy high-speed onboard WiFi and a complimentary porter service on relevant platforms.

Additionally, Kuala Lumpur offers various rail services such as MRT, LRT, KL Monorail, and KTM for seamless transportation within the city center. Get around easily and explore all that Kuala Lumpur has to offer!



### Bus

Buses offer the most budget-friendly transportation option between airports and the city, with a fleet of 44 air-conditioned coaches known for their safety and comfort. Fares can be as low as RM15 per passenger, and although travel times may vary, the average duration to reach the city is around 1 hour and 15 minutes.

Moreover, RapidKL buses provide feeder services to MRT, LRT, and Monorail stations, facilitating convenient transportation within the Klang Valley and to KL City. # *Introduction to* KUALA LUMPUR

Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia's bustling capital, stands as a testament to modern architecture and cultural diversity, boasting a plethora of attractions.

Covering approximately 243 square kilometers, Kuala Lumpur is experiencing significant population growth and economic progress, ranking as the ninth most visited city worldwide. In 2021, about 25% of Malaysia's population, approximately 2.0 million people, called Kuala Lumpur home. From 2010 to 2020, the city saw a gradual population increase of 2.2%.

Nestled at the meeting point of the Gombak and Klang Rivers, Kuala Lumpur sits 300 kilometers northwest of Singapore and roughly 40 kilometers east of the Strait of Malacca. Its name, "Kuala Lumpur" in Malay, translates to "muddy estuary," paying homage to its location where two rivers converge.

As one of Malaysia's three Federal Territories, alongside Putrajaya and Labuan, Kuala Lumpur has hosted notable events such as the 1998 Commonwealth Games and the 2017 Sea Games.

Looking ahead, Malaysia's GDP appears poised for healthy growth in 2024. In Q3 2023, the gross domestic product (GDP) rose by 3.3%, bringing the growth for the first nine months of 2023 to 3.9%. This aligns with the government's forecast of approximately 4% growth for 2023.



# 10 Facts

## 1. Yang di-Pertuan Agong is an Elected Monarch

In Malaysia, although it's not an absolute monarchy, the Yang di-Pertuan Agong is chosen through a unique rotational system for a five-year term by the Conference of Rulers. This process involves the Malay rulers, and the election procedures and regulations are outlined in both the Constitution's Third Schedule and the Conference of Rulers' regulations.



## 2. Home To The Second Tallest Tower in the World

Did you know that the Merdeka 118 Tower is now the second-tallest structure in the world? It's soaring to a height of 678.9 meters with 118 stories, making it the tallest building in Malaysia. The name "Merdeka 118" comes from its 118 levels. The tower's design is inspired by the outstretched hand gesture of Tunku Abdul Rahman, who famously said "Merdeka!" on Malaysia's Independence Day. This gesture serves as a model and inspiration for the tower's design.

## 3. KL Was the First Country in Asia to Host the Commonwealth

Kuala Lumpur hosted the Commonwealth Games for the first time in 1998. After that, the 2010 Games were held in Delhi, bringing the event back to Asia once again.



## 4. Hosted the SEA Games in 2017

Kuala Lumpur was praised for its successful organization of the 2017 SEA Games. This achievement not only raised the nation's profile but also set new records in medal achievements.



## 5. KL is The Retail and Fashion Hub of Malaysia

Kuala Lumpur was established in 1857 when a group of 87 Chinese tin miners promptly set up a settlement at this muddy confluence of rivers. Subsequently, the town was formally named Kuala Lumpur.



## 7. Parliamentary Democracy System

Malaysia operates under a political system defined by a constitutional monarchy and parliamentary democracy. In this system, the King serves as the sovereign head of state, while the parliament plays a central role as the primary institution responsible for upholding democratic principles and governance.



## 8. World's Tallest Twin Towers is in KL

The Petronas Twin Towers, the world's tallest twin towers, were among Malaysia's tallest structures until they were surpassed by the recently completed Merdeka 118.



## 9. Malaysian Government is in Putrajaya

Unlike the traditional setup where the government is centralized in the capital city, Malaysia's government is headquartered in Putrajaya. Putrajaya serves as both the administrative and judicial capital of the country, hosting numerous government offices.



## 10. The Malaysian King lives in KL@ Istana Negara

Located on Jalan Tuanku Abdul Halim (formerly Jalan Duta) in Kuala Lumpur is the official residence of the Yang di-Pertuan Agong, commonly known as the National Palace or Istana Negara.

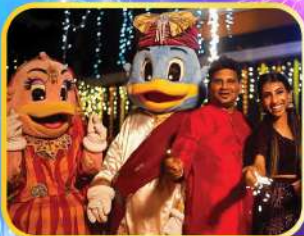

# HISTORY OF KUALA LUMPUR

The name “Kuala Lumpur,” which signifies “muddy confluence” in Malay, originated from tin miners exploring the Ampang region. Their mining activities brought them to the convergence of the Gombak and Klang rivers, prompting them to name the area Kuala Lumpur. The following is a chronological summary of Kuala Lumpur’s historical development.

**1857**

A contingent of 87 tin miners conducted exploration in the Kuala Lumpur vicinity, uncovering substantial tin deposits in Ampang.

**1862**

The swift development of Kuala Lumpur drew miners from diverse locations, resulting in an increase in population as well as conflicts, disputes, and gang rivalries.

**1869**

Yap Ah Loy, who led the Chinese community in Kuala Lumpur, played a pivotal role in instituting law and order. Additionally, he initiated the establishment of the city’s inaugural school and a refuge for the homeless.

**1880**

A British representative named Frank Sweetenham formulated an urban development plan to modernize Kuala Lumpur.

**1887**

Selangor designated Kuala Lumpur as its capital.

**1896**

Kuala Lumpur became the capital of the Federated Malay States following the union of the four state sultans.

**1910**

Arthur Benison Hubback, a prolific British colonial architect, was responsible for both the design and construction of Kuala Lumpur’s inaugural railway station.

The city was under Japanese occupation during World War II.

**1942**

Kuala Lumpur became the capital of the Malayan Federation.

**1946**

On August 31, Malaysia commemorated its Independence Day, signalling the conclusion of 151 years of British rule as they chose to depart from the nation.

**1957**

With an approximate population of 500,000, Kuala Lumpur encountered distinct administrative challenges.

**1960**

Kuala Lumpur was appointed as the capital city of Malaysia.

**1963**

Ethnic tensions escalated into a comprehensive civil conflict involving the Chinese and Malay communities.

**1969**

Kuala Lumpur attained the status of a city, becoming the first town in Malaysia to achieve this milestone after gaining independence.

**1972**

Kuala Lumpur became a Federal Territory with its own government.

**1974**

Prime Minister Dr. Mahathir initiated the "Vision 2020" program during his tenure, bringing about modernization not only in Kuala Lumpur but across the entire nation.

**1981**

Malaysia's federal administrative capital was relocated to Putrajaya.

## 1 & 2 JUNE - GAWAI

The Gawai Festival is a special celebration for the Dayak people in Sarawak. It happens in June and lasts the whole month, marking the harvest time. During this festival, Dayak culture is on full display, with traditional dances, lots of rice wine called Tuak, and big meals shared among everyone in the longhouse. Even Sarawakians living in other parts of Malaysia might join in, but it's mainly a Sarawak thing, showing off its unique culture and traditions.



## 17 & 18 JUNE - HARI RAYA HAJI

Although Hari Raya Aidilfitri and Hari Raya Haji share similarities, Hari Raya Haji holds a unique significance in Malaysia. Unlike other celebrations, Hari Raya Haji involves specific religious practices such as sacrificial-slaughtering, known as "korban," along with prayers and the distribution of food to the needy. This customary feast underscores the importance of giving back and serving the community, distinguishing Hari Raya Haji as a distinct and meaningful occasion in Malaysian culture.



## 31 AUGUST - INDEPENDENCE DAY

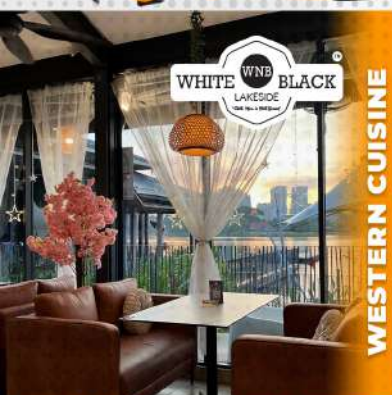

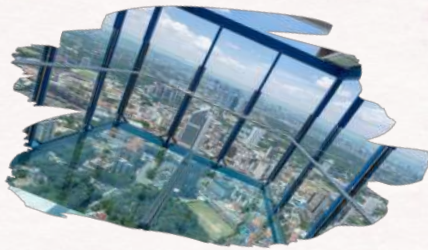

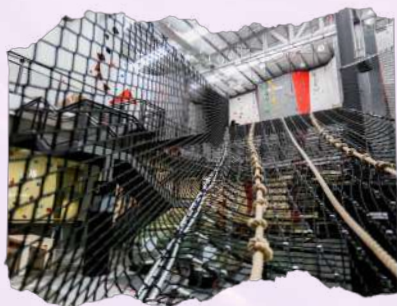

### Chicken Rice

### Ikan Bakar

Ikan Bakar means 'grilled fish' and it is a type of dish that is grilled using charcoal. This delicious dish can be found in Malaysia, Indonesia and various other South-east Asian countries. It is one of the popular dishes in Malaysia as it is also a staple dish for all seafood lovers. Before being placed on the hot grill, the fish is wrapped in banana leaves and seasoned with a spice marinade.



### Hokkien Mee

Hokkien Mee is one of the popular noodle dishes in Southeast Asia, especially in Malaysia. This dish is a savoury dish with chewy noodles smothered in a sweet salty soy sauce with prawns, pork belly, cabbage, and gailan. For the halal version, the pork and lard is replaced with halal ingredients instead. This dish has an origin of China's Fujian province.

### Apam Balik

One of Malaysia's favourite snacks is apam balik. There are several varieties of this sweet treat, which has Chinese origins, that may be found at any apam balik roadside stall in Malaysia. A thick and fluffy pancake known as an apam balik can be filled with a variety of ingredients, including sugar and butter, nestum, peanut butter, chocolate, sweet cream-style corn, and others.



### Cakoi

Malaysians adore the common snack known as cakoi. It is a long, golden-brown snack made of fried dough that is generally eaten for breakfast or tea with rice porridge, starch, or soybeans. Moreover, it can be consumed with kaya pandan as a dip. This food is available at both morning and evening street markets. It is better to consume the cakoi while it is still hot or warm because it is typically deep-fried.

### Keropok Lekor

Keropok Lekor, a type of fish sausage, is a common fish cracker snack that originated in the state of Terengganu. It is prepared using fish and sago flour and is salted and sweetened. It has a slightly greyish colour and emits a fishy flavour and smell, which are more noticeable when it cools after being fried. This is often eaten during tea time or just as a snack. You are also able to eat this snack with cheese as well.



### Rojak

Rojak, a popular Malaysian snack, consists of a mix of sliced fruits and vegetables served with a slightly spicy palm sugar dressing, often with sambal belacan. The dish offers a fusion of spicy, sweet, and salty flavors. Rojak Penang is a variation that includes acidic fruits like unripe mangoes and green apples, along with jambu air, guava, squid fritters, and honey. The sauce is typically thick and toffee-like in consistency.

Traditionally, an ice shaving machine, which was formerly hand-cranked but is now more commonly motorised, is used to churn out the shaved ice used in the dessert.

Cendol is a refreshing dessert consisting of palm sugar syrup, coconut milk, and green rice flour jelly. It can be customized with various toppings like durian, fermented sweet cassava (tapai), jackfruit, dragon fruit, and chocolate syrup. 

# *Sultan Abdul Samad Building*

## INTRODUCTION & CHARACTERISTIC

The Sultan Abdul Samad Building stands as one of Kuala Lumpur's oldest and most renowned historical landmarks, situated prominently on Jalan Tun Perak. Erected in 1897, it initially served as the administrative hub for British colonial rule and later housed Malaysia's superior courts. Exhibiting a blend of Moorish, Western, and Gothic architectural styles, highlighted by a towering 41.2-meter clock tower, it remains a favorite spot for tourists and locals alike to capture its grandeur through photographs. Designed by A.C. Norman, it was repurposed over the years, now serving as the Ministry of Information, Communication, and Culture office, and hosting Malaysia's Independence Day celebrations annually.

Originally utilized as the administrative center for the Federated Malay States, the Sultan Abdul Samad Building transitioned through various governmental functions, from the Government of Selangor State to national offices post-independence. Recognized for its historical significance, it was gazetted under the National Heritage Act (Act 645), symbolizing its iconic stature in Malaysia's heritage landscape.

Two-story building designed in a blend of Mahometan Style and Moorish architecture.

The Sultan Abdul Samad Building is designed in the shape of an "F" when viewed from above. The rear block was constructed in 1902-1903.

03

The Sultan Abdul Samad Building is known for its distinctive architectural style that showcases Islamic influences, as seen in the intricate decorative elements and semi-circular arches.

04

The bell clock, which weighs a massive 1 ton and is a whopping 2.43 meters in diameter, was created by Gillett & Johnston Ltd.



# Uniqueness

01

The building's architecture exhibits unique characteristics, including Islamic-inspired motifs on window and door designs, and semi-circular arches at the entrances.

02

It features an onion dome and minaret-shaped structures commonly found in mosque architecture.

03

A clock tower, standing approximately 40 meters tall, flanked by two small domes, provides an aesthetically balanced viewpoint.

04

The Sultan Abdul Samad Building, situated between Jalan Raja and Jalan Belanda, is the first main public building in this vicinity.





## THE CHRONOLOGY OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE SULTAN ABDUL SAMAD BUILDING

**1894**

In September 1894, the construction of the Sultan Abdul Samad Building commenced. The foundation stone was laid on October 6 by Sir Charles Mitchell, the Governor of the Straits Settlements.

Constructed in 1897, the Sultan Abdul Samad Building sits on 1.034 hectares of land and is made up of a variety of materials, such as 4 million bricks and 50 tons of steel. To guarantee top-notch materials, a brick and building materials factory was established nearby. Changes were also implemented during the building process, and the clock tower was crafted by Gillett & Johnston Ltd.

During the Queen Victoria Jubilee Parade in June 1897, the tower of the Sultan Abdul Samad Building chimed for the first time. This iconic building served as a hub for important government departments of the Federated Malay States during British colonial rule. Over time, new buildings and extensions were added to accommodate the expanding bureaucracy and address the shortage of office space.

**1903**

In 1903, an extension known as the rear wing was added to the Sultan Abdul Samad building.

**1907**

A building constructed in the same architectural style was added to the south to accommodate the General Post Office.

# Significant Moments in *Kuala Lumpur*

## 1974



Kuala Lumpur officially designated as a Federal Territory on February 1st, through a proclamation agreement signed at Istana Negara between the fifth Yang di-Pertuan Agong Sultan Abdul Halim Mu'adzam Shah Ibni Almarhum Sultan Badlishah and the Sultan of Selangor Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz.

## 1983

Various buildings in Kuala Lumpur, including Masjid Jamek, Institute for Medical Research, and Chartered Bank of India, Australia, and China buildings, were listed under the Antiquities Act 1976.



## 1986



Sudirman, a Malaysian icon, held a free mega event titled "Konsert Chow Kit Road" on April 14th, drawing over 100,000 attendees to Jalan Tuanku Abdul Rahman as a gesture of gratitude to fans who couldn't afford to attend his live performances.

## 1990

Kuala Lumpur marked its centennial anniversary of the local council on May 14th. During the celebration, the new Federal Territory of Kuala Lumpur flag and anthem were unveiled.



# 1991-1996



Beginning in October 1991, construction commenced on Menara Kuala Lumpur, a telecommunications and broadcasting tower soaring to a height of 421 meters above ground level, ultimately opening its doors to the public on July 23, 1996.

# 1992-1999

In 1992, the construction of the PETRONAS Twin Towers, renowned as the world's tallest twin towers, was initiated. Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad, serving as Prime Minister at the time, officially unveiled the towers in 1999, cementing their status as an iconic landmark in Kuala Lumpur's skyline.



# 1996

In November, Pudu Prison concluded a century of operation and ceased its functions. However, in 1997, it reopened for public tours for a short while. Subsequently, the site underwent redevelopment and has now transformed into Bukit Bintang City Centre (BBCC).



# 1998

Kuala Lumpur welcomed the 16th Commonwealth Games, commencing with the opening ceremony on September 11th. This marked a historic moment as it was the first time in the Games' 68-year history that they were hosted in Asia.





# 2001



In 2001, KL Sentral, a significant transportation hub and business district in Kuala Lumpur, was officially inaugurated on June 13th, serving as a centralized nexus for various modes of transportation including trains, buses, and the KLIA Express.

# 2007

The year 2007 saw the opening of the Stormwater Management and Road Tunnel (SMART), a pioneering 9.7km underground motorway and water channel designed to mitigate flooding in the city center, making it the world's first double-storey underground roadway.



# 2010

In 2010, Prime Ministers Najib Razak and Manmohan Singh opened Little India in Brickfields. Five years later, Najib and Prime Minister of India Narendra Modi unveiled the "Torana Gate" to promote Indian culture and cuisine in a RM32 million project.



# 2011

The home of the Yang di-Pertuan Agong, Istana Negara, stopped being his residence on November 15, 2011, after 54 years, marked by a special closing ceremony.



# 2011

The River of Life initiative, with a budget of RM4.4 billion, was introduced by the Federal Government in 2011 to rejuvenate Sungai Gombak and Sungai Klang.



# 2016



In 2016, the first phase of the MRT Kajang Line, which spans 23 kilometers from Sungai Buloh to Semantan, became accessible to the public on December 16. The second phase opened on July 27, 2017, while the MRT Putrajaya Line became fully operational in March 2023.

# 2017

In 2017, Ampang Park Shopping Centre, Malaysia's oldest mall, closed its doors on December 31 after nearly 45 years of operation. The mall was later demolished to make space for the MRT project, and a skate park now occupies the site.



# 2023

In 2023, The Exchange TRX, Kuala Lumpur's newest shopping center, welcomed visitors on November 29. Linked to the country's second tallest building, The Exchange 106, it serves as the heart of the city's new international financial district.



# 2024

Menara Merdeka 118, which is the second tallest tower in the world, was officially opened on January 10, 2024. It is 678.9 meters tall and has 118 floors. The tower includes a spire that represents Malaysia's declaration of independence, making it a significant landmark in the city.







Downtown KL, the main or central part of Kuala Lumpur, is characterized by tall buildings, stores, offices, and more. Downtown places are typically located in or towards the center of a large town or city, where shops and businesses thrive. Downtown Kuala Lumpur serves as the vibrant heart of Malaysia's capital city. While KL is renowned for being a vibrant metropolis, there are still some incredible places waiting to be discovered in the downtown area of this bustling urban landscape.

## Taman Tugu

Tapak Taman Tugu is protected from commercial developers who planned to build another awful mall on the site, which was once the site of government residences and then an unofficial dump. Instead, a 66-acre public park and conservation site with over 5 kilometres of paths was created.

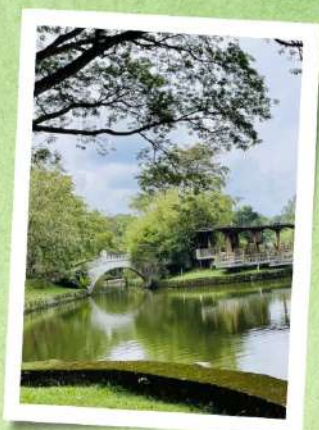

# Sabah

Sabah, known as the Land Below The Wind, is a state in East Malaysia situated in the northern part of Borneo. Its capital city, Kota Kinabalu, serves as the seat of the state government and the economic center. Other major towns include Sandakan, Tawau, and Keningau.

Sabah boasts an equatorial climate with lush tropical rainforests teeming with diverse flora and fauna. Mount Kinabalu, standing at 13,435 feet, is the tallest mountain in Malaysia and Borneo. The state also features long mountain ranges forming parts of the Crocker Range National Park. It's said that 10 sq. kilometers of Sabah host more flora and fauna than North America and Europe combined.

With an average temperature of 30°C year-round, Sabah experiences rainfall throughout the year, peaking during the North East Monsoon season from October to February. The months between May and September are generally hotter and drier.

Sabah is culturally diverse, with over 40 ethnic races and more than 80 local dialects. While various dialects are spoken, Bahasa Malaysia is widely used across ethnic groups. Customary practices, such as removing shoes when entering places of worship or homes, are observed, and some individuals may prefer not to engage in physical contact due to religious reasons.

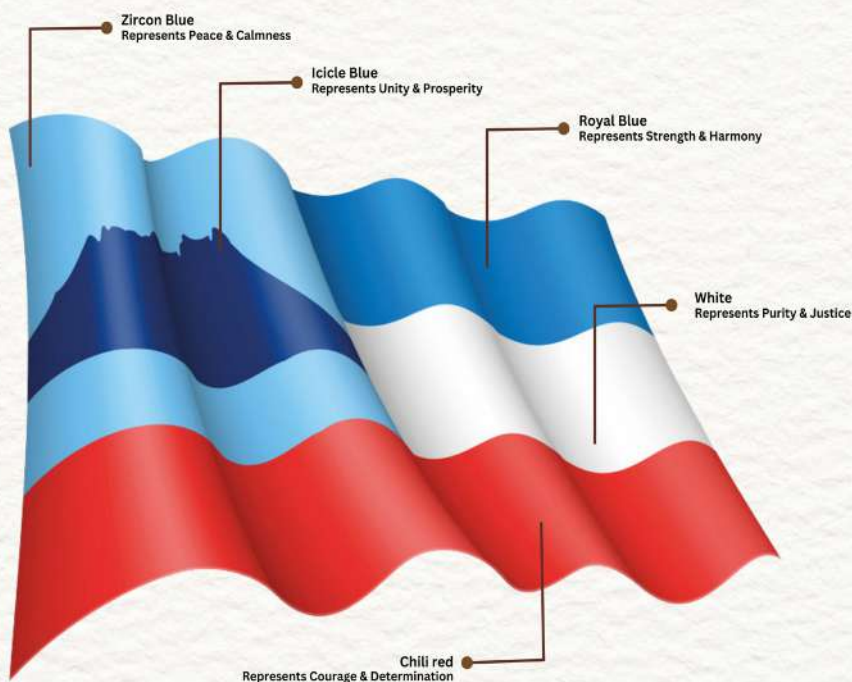
Despite its diversity, Sabah maintains traditional Malaysian customs, including proper attire and manners, with handshakes being a common gesture of greeting.



# History of Sabah

Sabah, a region in Borneo, went through a series of colonial administrations before joining Malaysia in 1963. Initially under the Sultanate of Brunei, it came under British influence in the late 18th century. The British North Borneo Company was established in 1882, and Sabah became a British protectorate in 1888. During World War II, it was occupied by the Japanese. In 1963, Sabah joined Malaysia, later renamed from the Alliance of Malaysia. Economic development began with the granting of extraction rights to Petronas in 1967. Political dynamics shifted with the rise of the Kadazan ethnic group's party in 1985. The rotation system for chief ministers was introduced in 1994, aiming for ethnic representation. Kota Kinabalu became the capital in 2000. The International Court of Justice settled territorial disputes in 2005. Present-day Sabah is characterized by educational, economic, and cultural progress, with 28 higher education institutions offering various programs.

## Public Transport

In Kota Kinabalu, you can find local buses and taxis for transportation within the city center. There are also local buses or mini buses in other districts in Sabah as well.



## Car Rental

Car rental services are available in Kota Kinabalu and other districts in Sabah. They offer a variety of vehicles, including compact sedans, 4-wheel drive vehicles, vans, and buses. It's advisable to arrange car rental through tour operators in advance.



## Boat and Ferries

Jesselton Point in Kota Kinabalu is a port where ships depart for Labuan, Brunei, and islands such as Pulau Sapi. The harbor is open from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., with the final boat leaving at 4:30 p.m. from the islands.



## By Train

The railway system in Sabah extends from Tanjung Aru station in Kota Kinabalu to Beaufort and Tenom. It takes less than 2 hours to reach Beaufort and around 5 hours to get to Tenom. The picturesque train journey along the Padas River gorge to Tenom provides a rejuvenating experience.



## By Plane

The Kota Kinabalu International Airport is the busiest airport in Sabah, providing direct flights to Sandakan and Tawau from both Kota Kinabalu and Kuala Lumpur.

# KOTA KINABALU

Kota Kinabalu, formerly known as Jesselton, is the capital of the state of Sabah. The city is located along the northwest coast of Borneo facing the South China Sea. The Tunku Abdul Rahman National Park lies on its west and Mount Kinabalu, which gave the city its name, is located towards the east.

Kota Kinabalu, is often known as KK within Malaysia and internationally. It is a major fishing destination and a popular gateway for travelers visiting Sabah and Borneo. Kota Kinabalu is a modern city with a long sandy beaches, paradise islands, virgin coral reefs, tropical rainforests; and the mighty Mount Kinabalu is only 90 minutes away.

Kota Kinabalu is named after Mount Kinabalu, which is situated about 50 kilometers east-northeast of the city. Kinabalu is derived from the name Aki Nabalu meaning the “revered place of the dead.” Aki means “ancestors” or “grandfather”, and Nabalu is the name for the mountain in the Dusun language. There is also a source claiming that the term originated from Ki Nabalu, where Ki meaning “have” or “exist”, and Nabalu meaning “spirit of the dead”.

## Sabah State Museum

The Sabah Museum, established in 1985 on the site of the former British North Borneo Governor's Istana, comprises the Main Building, Science and Education Center, and Heritage Village. Initially opened in 1965 on Gaya Street, it relocated to Bukit Istana Lama in Kota Kinabalu. The museum complex, spanning 17 hectares, features an ethnobotanical garden, zoo, and history village.

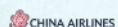
